You have strengths and weaknesses, and both are worthy of love, know them, honour them, and do not heed those who tell you that you must change in order to fulfil their expectation of you.


You will never be who others expect you to be. You can only be the unique individual you are meant to be.

When the young teacher saw the failure, he blamed the villagers. But they replied, "We followed your steps, but we didn't listen to the soil." Realizing his mistake, the teacher saw that true learning isn't about rigid instructions—it's about understanding, questioning, and growing through experience.

Moral of the Story: The best teaching nurtures curiosity, trust, and self-discovery. A true teacher guides, rather than controls, allowing students to learn from the wisdom within themselves.

The Light Within...

Everyone is born with a light inside them. At first, we may not realize it's there, like a lamp that hasn't yet been switched on. As children, we often look to others for guidance, love, and approval, unaware that we already carry something just as valuable within ourselves.

As we grow, we begin to notice the light in others. People who shine brightly in their own unique way. Some may be kind and wise, others confident and strong, and we may find ourselves admiring them, even wishing we could be like them.
